Horseshoes is generally a Spring Sport culminating in State competition at Summer Games. One Area is holding Horseshoes in the Fall. You may enter this competition or the competitions that will be available in the spring in order to qualify for Summer Games. All Athletes who compete in Area Horseshoes competition are qualified to compete at Summer Games. **This does not mean you are registered for summer games.** You must complete Summer Games registration in order to compete at Summer Games

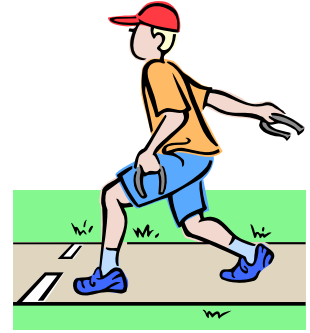
Each team must have a coach certified in the sport of Horseshoes

All Coaches must have a current Class A Volunteer Form on file and must take the Protective Behaviors class available on our website. You must meet these requirements to enter Area Competitions. All teams will have to have a certified coach in Horseshoes. You will not be able to enter an Athlete in Area or State Games competition if you do not have a Certified Coach on your team. Every Class A Volunteer with your team must have a Volunteer form on file and must have taken Protective Behaviors training on our Website www.sook.org You can check the Class A list on the website to see if you have met these requirements.

SOOK RULES of HORSESHOES

1. Horseshoes will be divisioned by age, with open competition in Singles & Doubles competitions.
2. Tournament format may vary but singles & doubles will be guaranteed at least 2 games.
3. The court will have a distance of 30' between stakes.
4. The stakes will be set in a 3' by 4' frame or box.
5. Each shoe that lands on or in the box will be scored 1 point - each ringer will be scored 3 points.
6. Players may use their own horseshoes, provided they are official weight and size and approved for competition by the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association. Shoes must weigh between 2 lbs. 2 oz. and 2 lbs. 10 oz.
7. The individual or team with the most points after 40 shoes are thrown will be declared winner.
8. In the event of a tie after 40 shoes have been thrown, 2 additional shoes will be thrown by each single or team to decide a winner.
9. No substitutions will be allowed.
10. Each court will have a judge and a scorekeeper.
11. All decisions by the judge are final.
