

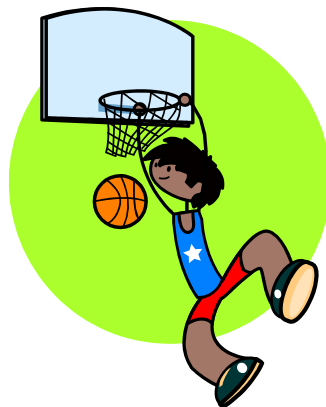
UNIFIED 3 ON 3 BASKETBALL

All Coaches must have a current Class A Volunteer Form on file and must take the Protective Behaviors class available on our website. You must meet these requirements to enter Area Competitions. All teams will have to have a certified coach in Basketball. You will not be able to enter an Athlete in Area or State Games competition if you do not have a Certified Coach on your team. Every Class A Volunteer with your team must have a Volunteer form on file and must have taken Protective Behaviors training on our Website www.sook.org

UNIFIED® 3-on-3 BASKETBALL RULES

1. Unified® 3-on-3 Basketball is a high level sport.
2. Athletes must have a good knowledge of rules and strategies of basketball.
3. Double dribble, traveling and other infractions will not be permitted.
4. The game will be played on half of a basketball court.
5. Each time the ball changes possession, it's taken back beyond the 3-point line @ top of the key.
6. Games will be played to 15 points or 30 minutes (running clock - no halftime).
7. The tournament format will be double elimination.
8. Divisions will be Jr. (8-15); Sr. (16-29); Master (30+).
9. The oldest player on a team determines the age division of the team.
10. A male on a team constitutes a male team.
11. Brackets will be by age and divisioning within a bracket.
12. Rosters will consist of 3 Special Olympics athletes & 2 Special Partners.
13. Line-up on the court must include 2 Special Olympics athletes & 1 Partner at all times.
14. Substitutions may be made during dead balls by notifying the scorekeeper.
15. Each team is allowed one 1-minute time-out per game.
